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Wynlakes Flowers-Dennis Weber

Flower beds at Wynlakes are changed out twice a year to make sure the proper flowers are in place for the weather conditions that are unique for that time of year. During the summer months we use flowers that are recommended for the hot, dry summers we experience here in Montgomery. During winter months the weather can vary from mild to very cold in a matter of days so flowers that are capable of quickly adapting from one extreme to another are needed.

Fortunately, for our winter season, we have the durable, yet very lovable pansy. Pansies are widely used throughout this area because they offer so many color variations, can withstand a hard freeze, and are not susceptible to the many diseases and insects which plague other flowers in our region. Once established, pansies require a weekly watering and do well with moderate fertilization on a timely basis. Deadheading will prolong the blooming period and keep the fresh appearance significantly.

Pansies were, and continue to be derived from the *Viola* species "Viola tricolor". They were cultivated in the early 19th century by an English gardener named Lady Bennett. Originally they were called several other names before the French began calling them "pensee", the name reflecting the resemblance of the flowers face to that of a pensive human face. By 1833 there were 400 named pansies available and today we can choose from varieties that we love for not only their showy color but also for their hardiness and performance during our cooler winter season.

About 6000 pansies are planted in a mix of 10-12 different varieties every year at Wynlakes. We hope you enjoy them.

3. Try to cross only at corners or marked crosswalks. Look carefully to the right and left for traffic before stepping into the street. Remember - walk don't run.

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
